As we all struggle with the fallout of this pandemic we can focus а positive thought....car season is getting closer. For many of us, car season never really ended. There are so many car enthusiasts across Canada that have decided to work on their cars during the lockdowns, building those projects locked in their garages, sometimes for decades. I am convinced we are going to see many more classic cars on the road this summer as well as some fantastic late models with beautiful upgrades. What a great way to fill the time spent at home, in your garage or shop working on your project.

World of Wheels has been postponed from the usual February date and is now tentatively scheduled for April 9th. I have started a discussion of possibly entering a club display, only if the risk is way down and it is safe to do so. What the pandemic situation will be like 2 -1/2 months from now is a factor for sure, but it is something to look forward to. I have already had some mem-

The insurance companies have removed the Director and Officers liability coverage from the policies for all clubs, the general liability remains and covers the members. I have recently discovered we can add this D&O coverage going forward at a minimal cost through Brokerlink insurance.

It is very disappointing that we haven't been able to attend our monthly club meetings due to the public gathering restrictions. This situation also impacted our AGM in November with our Executive position nominations. When we are finally able to get together again for a club meeting, we will have our 2020 AGM. In the meantime our Executive team

will remain as it was in 2020. Anyone looking to get more involved and join our Executive team still has an opportunity to do so.

I have joined the SVAA (Specialty Vehicle Association Of Alberta) Director team to represent our club and to help them continue to be a voice for the car hobby. Please check out the SVAA website and if you have any questions on any new legislation regarding the car hobby please ask. I will do my best to get you an answer.

## Mustang Trivia Figure DID YOU KNOW...

- Buhlie Ford, a nephew of Henry Ford II, took a ride in an early Mustang convertible in the spring of 1964 and left the car in a downtown Detroit parking lot. The Detroit Free Press published photos of the car in what was considered a major scoop before the official unveiling.
- On April 16, 1964, the day before its public unveiling, Ford sponsored simultaneous programs on the three major TV networks as part of a national marketing blitz. The Mustang was seen by 29 million people during prime time. The next day, Mustang ads ran in more than 2,600 newspapers.
- Ford took the Mustang on the road since many people could not see the car at its New York debut or at a dealership. The Mustang was put on display at 70 high-traffic metropolitan sites nationwide, 15 major airport terminals, in 100 Holiday Inns and on billboards in more than 170 markets.
- In 1964, the Mustang's base price \$2,368 was featured prominently in the company's initial advertising. It was \$1,000 lower than that of the closest competition.
- The first Mustang's VIN Number was 5F08F100001.
- Dealers were inundated with requests for the vehicle. In Garland, Texas, 15 customers bid on the same Mustang, and the winner insisted on sleeping in the car overnight to guarantee that it wouldn't get sold from under him before his check cleared the next day.
- Ford originally forecast about 100,000 Mustang sales in the first year. More than 400,000 were sold.
- The 1967 Mustang was available in two shades of pink: dusk rose and Playboy pink



#### **Bob & Lorraine...**

This profile is supposed to be all about the Walkers and my many Mustangs, but I'm going to go back a few years before I purchased my first Mustang. When I was a youngster I read a book titled "The Red Car ", it was a story involving a boy and a red MG/TC. I guess this story made more of an impact on me than I realized at the time. The first clue was a MG dinky toy I bought and painted red. The second clue was at the age of 19, I spotted a 1952 MGTD for private sale in Regina Sask. and I bought it. This would be my sixth car since turning 16, and my first collector car. I was a university student and this was a daily driver, (what was I thinking). After one winter in Saskatoon, I needed something warmer, I took out a student loan and bought a hot 1964 Pontiac Custom Sport. This car led to a lot of issues between me and the authorities, nuff said. In the mid 70's I was transferred to

Edmonton, and needed a car to commute to work. I was looking at new Celica's, but decided if I bought a used Mustang and kept this car in good shape it shouldn't depreciate. A short search and I bought a 66 spring time yellow coupe, 289, 3speed on the floor. Bought for \$2200, put 100,000 miles on it and sold for \$4500. I was in Lethbridge by now with two kids and I finally realized how impractical the MG was, it got sold at the annual Okotoks auction. My new neighbor in Lethbridge was Barry Tollestrop (AMAC club member) he has been into Mustangs for ages. One day he came over and told me his old 66 convert went through a Calgary auction and didn't sell at \$7500, and then he gave me the phone #. He had restored this car, and put a great Burgundy paint on it with a heavy metallic, looked out standing.

Needless to say I came up to Calgary looked at the car and bought it. Now I had the yellow coup and the burgundy convert. I was transferred to Calgary in 1990 and the 66 convert is the car I



brought to Calgary and joined the AMAC with. We attended our first IMM at the Blackfoot Inn where because of our newness to the club, we got to know more international folks than Calgary folks. But now we were hooked on the club and IMM's. A few years later at an Edm international, I was intrigued with a 1985 SVO and thus began my search for one. I found one in Barons Alberta, low miles as the owner was living in the UK. At the time he thought that the UK was temporary and he would some day be back to Alberta and his car. This was not to be, resulting in the car coming up for sale. His car was being stored on a farm in a barn, (true barn find). The kids and I went down and bought it. This car is probably the Mustang I kept the longest. After owning it for a couple of years, this car was stolen in the middle of the afternoon out of my drive way while I was at Fernie skiing. It was gone for several months, according to



CPS it was used in a few B&E's . I was paid out for the car, and a few months later got a phone call from the police that it was picked up in S,E, Calgary and was in the Manchester lot. Son Brad and I went down to see the car; it was laying on its bottom, no wheels or tires, broken transmission, broken glass, no rear spoiler, a few dents, beer cans and cigarette buts all over a filthy interior. I put my key in the ignition; fired right up, but complete exhaust system had been torn off, no blue smoke engine sounded really good. I bought it back from insurance for salvage value \$1500. Now from what I was paid out I had money left to repair the car to a better car than it was before it was stolen. Thanks to Lakeview Shell and Fred Crane, for much mechanical work. Rick Hootmer for finding parts, and Wrinkles for body work and paint and I was back to a very great looking fox body. This was now a show car, but everyone in the family used it, for dates, groceries, soccer etc.

The Burgundy convert was still in my possession, but I was loosing interest and it was sold down East, and the search was on again. This time I bought Russ Penner's 65 GT fast back. This car came to our garage as a shell, on a home made dolly, and one or two truck loads of parts. If I remember right the body may have had the front and back glass and head liner in it, all body work and paint was complete. The shell and all the parts took up all the floor space in a rather large garage. As assembly progressed, Lorraine noticed the chequing account was never flush, but she never said anything until years later. I admit Mustang wives have to be very considerate and understanding of our passion.

I had always kept my cars in good shape and clean but this restoration was new to me. I believe for every hour of work, there was a minimum of 2-3 hours of research and this car was detailed to the nuts. This is the car that earned me the club Kiwi award. I was not there to receive the award as Lorraine and I were on a gulf islands cycling holiday. Daughter Carmen decided to take the car to the presidential, she told me about it after it was all said and done. One day I had an unexpected phone call, a stranger asking about my car, I assured him it was not for sale, but sure he could come and look at it. Money talks and it was sold.

By this time we had a lot of Mustang friends, and car friends were definitely a large part of our social life. Joe Jurcik became a close friend and we were doing a lot of car stuff together. In one conversation he told me about a 68 GT/CS in Lethbridge, (I knew about the car from living down there). Joe was a couple of years pursuing this car. The owner had two GT/CS's and finally said, if Joe wanted the GT car he had to take both. I said to Joe, "so what's the problem", you take the Burgundy car and I'll take the silver. We purchased the two cars for \$25,000. Joe paying 13 for the GT car and I paid 12 for the non GT car. Even 20 or so years ago we got these cars at a bargain. Joe did a full restoration on the GT car; I did a few electrical and cosmetic changes on the silver car. Shortly after completion of both our cars Joe told me he was going to sell. I had helped Joe with some of the work on his car and saw a great deal of the restoration, so I knew it was an excellent car. Pretty much bought it on the spot and sold the



silver one to Manitoba. We enjoyed several years with this car; lots of shows, cruises and road trips and then I was searching for something newer. Some time in this history of cars I had a cycling accident and badly injured my back. It was getting harder and more painful to crawl under cars and dash panels, lean over engine bays etc. just time to move on to a newer car.

Next up 1999 Cobra convertible; lovely low kilometer car in great shape, plus Red with tan interior. I had looked at the car in Calgary a year before, and it was sold and went to Fort Mac. When I saw it for sale again I phoned the guy up and asked what was changed since I saw it; basically only a few more kilometers than the distance Calgary to Ft. Mac and new tires. It was now cheaper than when I had looked at it a year earlier. I bought it over the phone flew up and drove it home. Drove it and had fun for about 4 years, then the search was on again.



This time I wanted Neil Burton's dads Thunderbird; he hadn't been driving it but was not ready to sell. I found basically the same car in Victoria, bought it, flew out and drove it home. I only had it a year, and decided it was a lovely car but not for me. Now I'm searching for a good 03-04 Mach 1, preferably Azure Blue, definitely not Red. ( Just too many of these cars in Red ). I found the car I wanted on a farm west of Red Deer. It was not blue but Competition Orange, a rare color for these cars; it had less than 35k kilometers and in great shape (another car in a barn).

This will be my fourth year with this car; it should be for sale this summer. I know the car I want, 08 – 12 GT/Cs convertible. Only one problem, the specific car I really want, the owner is not ready to sell because he can't find the next car he wants. Do I wait? Or do I move on? Too many cars and not enough time.

This was probably more than you wanted to read, so I left out a few Mustangs:

1980 Fox body coup, kids and I put in \$300 each and it was their car.

1966 Red Fastback 2+2, son Brad our helicopter pilot spotted it from the chopper, in the bush North of Grand Prairie. Joe Jurcik and I dragged it home and parted it out. The body piece between the rear glass and trunk is now incorporated in Russ Grey's GT fastback.

1964.5 Coup bought and sold to Husky Oil, they gave the car away in a raffle or draw and it is currently in Cochran

1985 GT Mustang bought it to drive while SVO was stolen and was taking time to restore.

To sum up having Mustangs and the AMAC has been great fun and a large part of our lives. We have thoroughly enjoyed participating in many club activities, Internationals and cruises. Mustangs and skiing are my two favorite passions, I try to not let one interfere with the other. When you read this Lorraine and I will be at our cottage skiing, and looking foreword to another season of enjoying our Mustang.
