








# ANAC Member Profiles

## Russ & Teresa

Like several other members have mentioned in previous Profiles, there also was a Mustang II early in my "Mustang history". My ownership of one started in the fall of 1978. I spotted a '78 Cobra II on the used car lot of Metro Ford. It was black on black, 302, and with a 4-speed. The car had around 6000 miles on it when I purchased it. Had fun with it for over a year. For some of you long-time Calgarians, you will also notice the obligatory "CKXL 1140" bumper sticker, that many of us had on our cars. I never saw the car again after I sold it, but I have wondered about it many times.

The next Mustang I owned was a 1970 Mach I. It was for sale on 20th Ave NW, but it was not running. As well, the front end was in poor shape. The front fenders and hood had lots of bondo from a previous collision, and then the car had been involved in another front-end collision. This was in the fall of 1979. The car also needed a front grille, fender, bumper, front valance, passenger door and more. Spent that winter and the next spring chasing down parts and putting the car back together again. That winter (1980) I started going to the Mustang Club meetings at the Penbrooke Community Hall, however I did not get a lot of help there. My '70 Mach was too new! The people I met at the time were only into '65-68 Mustangs, so I did not spend much time with the Club during the next few years. My work on the



Mach included cutting a hole in a good hood, to make the factory hood scoop functional (sorry about that Jim B).

I also decided not to paint the car the factory Red, (everybody has a red Mustang...) but instead some Bronze colour. Why??? After the car was put together and painted, and I started driving it, I realized that all my carpets would get wet when I drove it in the rain. I realized the floors were quite rusty, and I was better off selling the car. (it certainly would have sold quicker if it had been that factory Red...) I also never saw this car again.

Around this time is when I started my ownership of multiple 1971-73 Grande's. One of the first ones was a very nice low-mileage, rust-free '72; 302, and blue on blue with a white vinyl top. One weekend during the summer of 1983, while out camping with the car, some guy stopped at our site, and talked to me about the Mustana. Turns out he was the current President of the Club, and he suggested that I should become active again. This is where I started participating with the Club and have basically been a member ever since. (this would also have been around the time that Ted Brailsford and I became friends). Later that fall I was in a serious collision with the car, on my way home from work. I was west-bound on Glenmore, sitting at the red light at Elbow Drive, when I was suddenly rearended by a 5-ton truck when the driver did not stop in time. I had very much enjoyed the car, but found out very quickly that insurance companies do not try and fix Mustangs that have been smacked by 5-ton trucks...

I did quickly find a twin to this car, and purchased it; enjoying it for several years. I ended up putting a large number of miles on this Grande; as it was my daily-driver, and my job at the time entailed traveling around Central Alberta. In fact, one year I put about 62,000 miles on the car (yes, 100,000 kms in one year) I would



often drive to Red Deer and back four times a week, with other trips to Rimbey or Drumheller or Rocky Mountain House or Strathmore. The car never failed me, but I did a lot of oil changes. At some point though, with the mileage well past 100,000 miles, I sold the car. It still presented well, and I did not hide what the mileage was. Then several years later, a new Club member who knew I liked '71-73 Grandes talked to me about a nice low-mileage one he has just purchased. Turned out that he had bought my old car. He was a little disappointed when I told him the odometer had rolled over already when I owned it. Him and his wife still enjoyed it for several years more.

This '72 was the car I took to the very first annual Club show and shine in the fall of 1984. This show became the Presidential and was started and organized by Larry Lucas.

The fall of 1984 was also when several of us guys decided to check out the International Mustang Meet; IMM V, that was being held in Edmonton. We had heard there would be a bunch of nice Mustangs at this event, and that this would be a good weekend. Well, we all went to Edmonton with our Mustangs; had a great time, and that was the beginning of my attendance at the IMM.

In the summer of 1985, I came across a Mustang that I just had to have; a '65 Fastback. I used the monies I received for my injuries the previous year when my '72 was wrecked, to help pay for this car.



(BTW, I do not recommend getting hit by a 5-ton truck as a way of making extra money; certainly not worth it; not even in 1984). This is also when Teresa came into the picture. Her and I drove to IMM VI in Great Falls, MT for the September long weekend in 1985, with the '65. We would own this car for the next several years. We also used Mustangs for our wedding cars in June of 1986; including a '69 Mach I, 428SCJ, 4-speed, a '72 Mach I, 351C, and our 289-powered '65 Fastback. We ended up selling the '65 when we purchased our first house.

In the meantime, we continued to have dailydriver Mustangs; oftentimes both Teresa and I



had one. Usually they were '71-73 Grande's with Teresa also having a '70 coupe for awhile.

In the early-mid '90's we also had a '65 GT Fast-back. I only drove it for about a 0.5 hour. It was a true GT, Pony interior, console car. I fully disassembled it before ever really enjoying it, and then started a concours restoration over several years. (Bob Walker ended up buying and finishing the car and enjoying it for quite some time). Great looking car.

In the spring of 2002, I found a rust-free, never-wrecked Green '66 Coupe in Winfield, BC. Ted B helped me get the car back to Calgary. Over the next several years, I kept improving the car, as it had many incorrect parts on it; both in the engine bay and interior. I sold this car in 2006 to a friend of Norm J's, who is still enjoying the car today.

In the spring of 2004, we purchased an unmolested Black 1987 GT T-Top Hatchback from the second owner. It had never been modified, and still had the air intake silencer in the passenger front fender. We enjoyed the car for a few years, while continuing to keep it stock. I could certainly own another Fox-body again.

April 2006 was when we purchased the Wimbledon White 1966 GT Fastback. It still had all of the original sheet metal, and was mostly correct. I tried for nearly a year to buy this car before I was successful, from a fellow Club member at the time who was known to not keep his cars very long. A rust-free, clean, straight, nicely optioned GT fastback, 289-4V and with a black interior. Oh yes. Over the next 6 years, we enjoyed the car, kept improving it as well, and with multiple road trips to the IMM and more. This car is now being enjoyed (and taken care of) by a great Mustang couple here locally.

There was another car that I had been watching for a couple of years, that the original owner took very good care of, and had kept the mileage down. It was the 2008 Shelby GT convertible that Albert O used to own. Well, in early 2012 we were able to purchase that car. As a 4 year old car, it had less than 5400 miles on it when we



brought the car home. We very much enjoyed road trips in this car with our fellow Club members. Then in the spring of 2015, we ended up purchasing a twin to this car, except this one had a manual transmission. The first car, an automatic car, is now being enjoyed by another local Mustang couple. This latest car is what is currently in the garage. No idea what the next Mustang we will own is, but right now – no plans to sell what we have.




